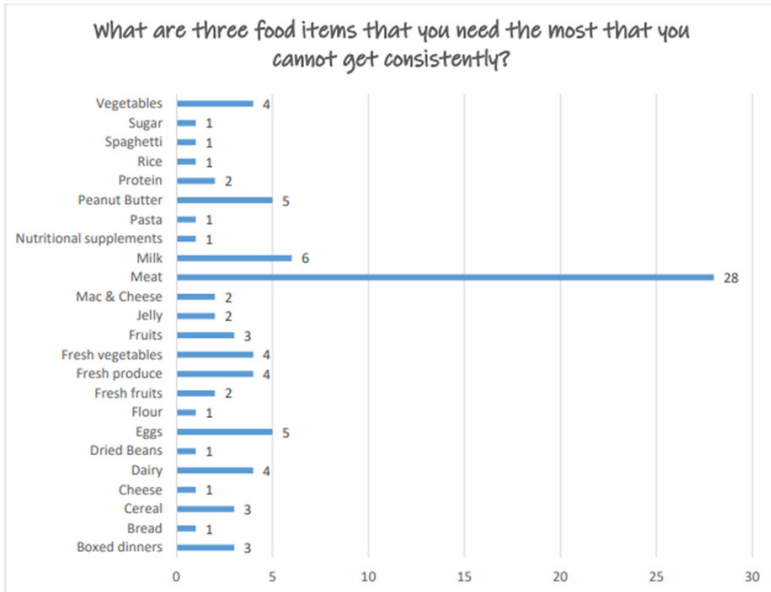

Why do we focus on providing meat?

A recent survey by the Mary E. Bivins Foundation found that 28 of 31 food pantries surveyed said that meat protein was one of the top three food items that they need the most that they cannot get consistently. Cactus Cares works to build a consistent protein supply for these food pantries. While we feel like we have made great strides in fighting this problem over the past few years, there is still a lot of work left to do to make sure that everyone in our communities has access to a consistent supply of meat. This is why we will continue to focus on growing our services in 2024 including expanding our P.O.W.E.R. Program.





Executive Director's Letter

Dear Stakeholders,
Gratitude

Looking back on 2023 only one word can truly summarize Cactus Cares – gratitude. We are incredibly thankful to be able to work every day to alleviate hunger starting in our own communities. This has continually provided opportunities for us to work in each of the communities we provide meat to and see the day-to-day impact hunger can have on people. Overall, we want to express our most sincere thanks to all those who have supported us throughout the year.

We would be nowhere without our donors. Our generous donors make our work possible through their willingness to give. We are thrilled to have more than 350 donors throughout the year including Cactus Feeders and Cactus Family Farms employees who continue to surpass our expectations. We had over 25 employees participate in our Pounds of Pork campaign which allowed us to donate over 625 pork loins to those in our local communities.

One of our most powerful donations is our volunteers' willingness to donate their time. Without our volunteers' unwavering support, we would not



have been able to pull together meals for those in Perryton after the tornado struck. This natural disaster was a strong reminder of why we do what we do, because hunger is never planned. Thanks to those who assisted us we were able to serve over 1,000 meals to those devastated by the storm.

Our volunteers across the country who consistently give up time to roll up their sleeves and help is a huge part of why the Snak-Kit program has been such a success. The monthly packing nights give 720 kids a bag to bring home to alleviate hunger over each weekend.

We know we must grow to continue spreading our impact on our community and our world. Our fundraisers have grown traction and produced record funds for the year. The third annual Amarillo golf tournament tripled funds

from the inaugural year thanks to all those who volunteered and/or participated. We expanded our fundraising by hosting an inaugural golf tournament in Iowa and were blown away by the results. Each event allows us to not only grow our funds and our donations but our brand which gives us countless more opportunities to expand partnerships.

Our POWER program is a result of our brand expansion. Working with eight universities has given us 36 more opportunities and organizations to give meat donations across our country. The unique piece of this program is how we can multiply the contributions to help not only feed hungry college students but support students studying agriculture across the nation. Some of our highlights from the POWER program include working with West Texas A&M to donate 17,000 pounds of meat in the Canyon & Amarillo area. Each organization served was handpicked by an employee owner. Another important highlight is the Oklahoma Collegiate Cattle-Women's t-shirt fundraiser where they partnered with the OSU baseball team to host an Eat Beef baseball game. All the proceeds from the limited-edition shirts went to feed those in the Stillwater community. We are grateful to see the growth Cactus Cares has



achieved over the years and are excited to continue expanding.

Finally, we are grateful in our ability to give. Not many people's job is so focused on simple generosity. Backed by our mission to feed a hungry world, we have worked to provide 175,000 pounds of meat or 700,000 servings to 60,000 families since 2020. We don't stop at giving meals but also give students opportunities to grow by giving \$60,000 in scholarships to 43 students of Cactus Feeders' employees.

Our greatest gift is our ability to give, and it is one we don't take lightly. We are grateful for the work we've been able to accomplish over this past year and are even more grateful to expand our goals for 2024 thanks to the support we have received. Thank you!

Cactus Cares Participates in Inaugural BBQ & Brew Contest in Des Moines

On July 15th, Cactus Cares was honored to be the charity selected for the Inaugural BBQ & Brew at the Ballpark in Des Moines. This BBQ contest was hosted by the Iowa Cubs & the Iowa Pork Producers Association. Cactus Cares hosted the People's Choice portion of the BBQ contest. Each of the 29 competitors present cooked pork butts that were available to the public for tasting. The public then voted on which pulled pork they preferred by donating dollars to their favorite team. All dollars raised went to Cactus Cares to purchase pork for local food pantries. Together we raised over \$3,500! The winner of this year's



People's Choice Award was Matty Mack's BBQ. As part of their prize, they won a \$1,500 donation of ground pork to the feeding charity of their choice! Matty Mack's selected the Food Bank of Iowa in Ottumwa to receive their ground pork donation.

SNAK-KIT

Snak-Kit is a local organization committed to providing weekend food items to help decrease hunger, so school-age children can focus on their learning.

Located in Manning, South Carolina, Snak-Kit was founded in 2019 in order to help alleviate weekend hunger within the local school district. Our investment over the past few years has enabled Snak-Kit to grow the number of children receiving weekend food bags from 25 kids per week to 720 kids per week. Our goal is to continue to grow this program to expand to support additional school-age children in need within Clarendon County! In 2024, one of Snak-Kit's goals is to continue to grow opportunities for the public to get involved.

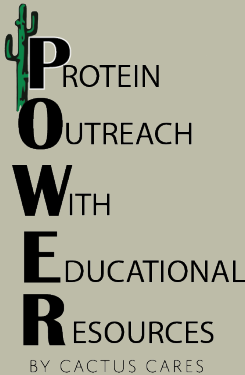


Cactus Cares P.O.W.E.R. Program

What is the program?

The Cactus Cares P.O.W.E.R. Program, formerly known as the University Meat Lab Program, was started in March 2020 when we began sourcing ground beef from the West Texas A&M Meat Lab-Doc's Prime Cuts. In this program, we purchase protein from University Meat Laboratories and donate the product to local food pantries and other organizations.

Multiplication Effect

This creates a multiplication effect- we are able to support both agricultural education and food pantries using the same dollar. The program started with WTAMU and has since expanded to include eight universities across the country.

West Texas A&M University

West Texas A&M University was the first meat laboratory we partnered with, and it has remained one of our strongest partners. This year, we sourced over 17,000 pounds of meat from Doc's Prime Cuts. This meat was used to serve 19 different organizations in the Texas Panhandle area. Each of these organizations were handpicked by an employee-owner. Washington Street Family Service Center

Over the course of 2023, we were thrilled to supply the Washington Street Family Service Center with a consistent supply of animal protein each month.



Project Hope

Project Hope was an early partner for Cactus Cares and that partnership continues today. We continue to ensure that Project Hope has a consistent protein supply for their recipients. Project Hope is the food pantry that services the Hugoton, Kansas community.



Eveline's Sunshine Cottage

We are excited to continue filling the freezers at Eveline's Sunshine Cottages in 2024! Eveline's Sunshine Cottages are a group of homes where single parent families are able to live with their children while they finish their education. Through this process, single parent moms move from homelessness and hopelessness to a college degree.



WTAMU On-Campus Food Pantry

After establishing our relationship with Doc's Prime Cuts, their leadership approached us with an opportunity to help supply protein to the WTAMU On Campus Food Pantry. We are thrilled to continue to supply protein to the students, faculty, and staff of WTAMU throughout the year.

Cactus Cares has purchased protein from West Texas A&M to support the following organizations:



Sharing Hope

Sharing Hope is a program for women who are transitioning from incarceration back into society. Once graduated from the program, Sharing Hope continues to help support the women. One way is by hosting a food pantry for all graduates. We provide protein for this food pantry.



Veteran's Resource Center

In 2023, we were proud to continue supplying the Veteran's Resource Center with ground beef & ground pork! This meat is used to supply both veterans that are using the resource center and women escaping domestic abuse through their safe house program!



Hamilton County Food Pantry

In 2023, we were thrilled to continue supplying meat to the Hamilton County Food Pantry in Syracuse, Kansas! Our donations consisted of 400 pounds of ground beef each quarter. "This is a game changer for us. Our biggest limiting factor is affordable protein for our baskets", said Hamilton County Food Pantry President Lora Horton.



The Tillie Project

The Tillie Project is managed through Snack Pak 4 Kids. This project is aimed at helping the grandparents in Amarillo ISD who are raising their grandchildren and due to those circumstances are experiencing food insecurity. We make sure ground beef and ground pork is available to these grandparents!



Iowa State University

Iowa State University is currently our primary meat lab supplier for operations in the Upper Midwest. We greatly appreciate their partnership and responsiveness to all of our requests. Together we have supplied over 12,000 pounds of protein to multiple groups across the state of Iowa. Just a few of these groups are highlighted on the next few pages.

We have also partnered with the ISU Block & Bridle club to expand our outreach. Together we have supplied S.H.O.P. (Students Helping Our Peers), the on-campus food pantry, with a consistent supply of animal protein over the course of 2023. We are excited to continue the partnership in 2024!

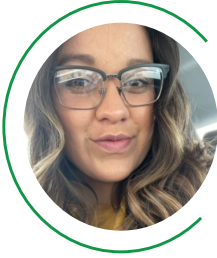
Mississippi State University
